Message from your Board of Directors

November's General Meeting will be an important meeting and you are highly encouraged to attend. The Board will be discussing items that will potentially impact the future of how Shadow Brook operates as an HOA and Swim Club.

For several years the Board has attempted to recruit and fill open Board positions. Unfortunately, this effort has been unsuccessful. Not only have we had an open position for two years, the current Board's average tenure is over 7 years. This is too long of a commitment and new ideas and shared ownership is needed.

Architectural Control Committee Update

The ACC recently completed the annual neighborhood walk around. This curbside review of the neighborhood is done to ensure the look and feel of Shadow Brook is maintained per our CCR's and Policies. Follow up letters, over 100, were sent to Homeowners where improvements were needed such as replacing bare dirt, maintaining parking/sidewalk strips and replacing dead lawns.

Many Homeowners acknowledged the ACC notification and the corrections needed. To date, about 60% of these warning letters have been addressed and there is a noticeable difference throughout the neighborhood. The ACC will continue to work with the remaining homeowners to quickly resolve outstanding issues.

Street Tree Trimming

There seems to be some confusion as to what is required before any homeowner trims or removes a street tree.

City of San Jose code **requires** that a permit be obtained before any trimming or removal of a street tree is done. Improper trimming (especially heavy cut back of the natural crown) can damage a tree and shorten its lifetime. Emergency situations are exempt.

Furthermore, the City of San Jose code requires that every homeowner "shall maintain and replace if necessary" the street tree in their parking strip (13.28.400). Failure to do this can result in fines for both the Homeowner and the tree trimmer.

Deep watering prevents sidewalk & curb damage and keeps trees healthy.

Miscellaneous

- Garbage cans are to be stored so they are not visible from the street on non-pickup days.
- There is an issue with yard waste being placed in the street too early prior to pick up days. This leads to parking and safety issues. All remaining debris must be cleaned up by the Homeowner to prevent it being blown over the neighborhood. You may want to consider adding a yard waste container so the waste is only handled once and is not left in the street.

If you are changing the appearance of the exterior of your home – including, but not limited to, landscaping, roofing, remodeling, painting or siding – you must contact Shadow Brook's Architectural Control Committee ("ACC") at acc@shadowbrook.org prior to commencing any work.

Please check our website for notifications, HOA documents, policies, and approval guidelines.

 Please allow a minimum of two weeks for the ACC to review and approve your project once an ACC request form is filled out and submitted to the ACC.
