Candy Apples



INGREDIENTS

- 4 medium apples (about 1½ pounds total), such as Granny Smith, McIntosh, or Honeycrisp, washed and dried, at room temperature.
- 4 (8-inch) sturdy treat sticks
- 2 cups/405 grams of granulated sugar
- 1/3 cup/80 milliliters light corn syrup
- 1 vanilla bean, split and seeds scraped, or $1\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons vanilla extract
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- -1/4 teaspoon kosher salt

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Line a baking sheet with a silicone baking mat or a piece of lightly greased parchment paper. Place the apples onto the prepared baking sheet, and press a treat stick firmly into the stem end, into the center of each apple.
- 2. In a medium pot, combine the sugar, corn syrup, ½ cup water, vanilla bean seeds (discard the pod) or extract, cinnamon, and salt. Stir the mixture over medium heat until the mixture begins to bubble at the edges, about 5 minutes once it begins to bubble, stop stirring.
- 3. Cook the mixture (without stirring) until it reads 300 degrees on an instant-read thermometer, about another 10 to 15 minutes. Leave the syrup mixture in the pot, and cool to 275 degrees. (The mixture will cool quickly; if it cools too much, it can be reheated until fluid.)
- 4. Working quickly, dip 34 of an apple into the sugar syrup, tilting the pot as needed to coat. Hold the apple over the sugar syrup, letting the excess drip off, then transfer it to the baking sheet. Repeat with the remaining apples, reheating the sugar syrup as necessary. Cool completely before serving.

lemon juice, a couple of teaspoons at a time. If it isn't sweet enough, stir in sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, until dissolved. Refrigerate until the tea is chilled throughout. Serve in a large glass filled with ice and garnished with peach slices.

Fall is in the air and it's time to order our Shadow Brook front yard Charlie Brown holiday yard trees!

This is our fifth year! Last year we had 84 street trees and 563 red bows brightening our community. We encourage you to join the neighbors who ordered and decorated front yard trees last year for the holiday season. Light is an important component of winter holidays from Diwali through the Lunar New Year.



Light Up Shadow Brook and make your home brighter for your family, the confined senior across the street, and those of us walking, running, and biking the neighborhood. The more homes with a Charlie Brown tree, the greater the impact on our community.

Trees are 5-7 foot fresh Douglas fir lightweight yard trees from Washington state that are mounted in the front yard using rebar stakes.

Last day to order: November 1st

\$23.00 Tree includes zip ties

\$33.00 Tree, zip ties, and 6-foot rebar stake

Pick up at pool: Friday after Thanksgiving, November 30th

If you are unable to pick up, arrange with a neighbor to pick up your tree. They are lightweight enough to be carried home or moved by wagon or back of an SUV or van.

Volunteers are needed to act as block leads, tree lot order pickup coordinators, and red bow fluffers and hangers.

This is our 6th year for the Red Bow Brigade. Block leads and volunteers are also needed to hang street tree red bows by 12/1/20.
